POLICY

To provide guidelines for attire of nursing and staff that work in clinical areas that promotes a professional appearance while adhering to hospital and regulatory recommendations. (Refer to Hospital Policy: Human Resources - Employee Relations Dress Code).

PROCEDURE

- I. Name tags must be worn above the waist at all times in a fashion that is easily read by all customers.
- II. Overall Appearance All Nursing Service Personnel (To include all RN's, Patient Care Tech's, ER Techs, and Unit Clerks).
 - A. Uniform/scrub uniforms only are to be worn. Uniforms/scrub uniforms must be clean, neat, and appropriately fitted.
 - B. Scrub dresses will be knee length or longer.
 - C. Home-sewn scrubs should resemble commercially sold scrubs.
 - D. Tops may <u>not</u> be:
 - 1. Sleeveless
 - 2. Low cut at the neck
 - 3. Sheer or thin gauze material
 - 4. T-shirts (solid color or Mercy issued T-shirts may be worn)
 - 5. Open midriff style
 - 6. Jogging style
 - 7. Hooded style

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- 8. Character prints must be no more than three inches in height
- 9. Camouflage material
- E. Pants should be modestly fit with appropriate length and may <u>not</u> be:
 - 1. Jean or white denim material
 - 2. Skin tight knit or legging style
 - 3. Tight knit or stretch pants style
 - 4. Sweat or jogging style
- F. Proper undergarments are to be worn so they are not noticeable under fabric of scrubs.
- G. Isolation PPE attire is not to be worn outside of a patient's room.
- H. Solid color socks that match the uniform must be worn.
- I. Footwear must be clean. For safety reasons, footwear must not be open at the toe. Sandals or shoes with holes are <u>not</u> permitted to be worn by staff in any patient care area.
- J. Colored accessories such as belts, suspenders, or ties are <u>not</u> permitted.
- K. Jewelry should be modest, non-dangling, and not excessive.
 - a. Jewelry should be non-dangling with earrings no more than ¹/₄" in length.
 - b. Body jewelry (as it relates to body piercing of the nose, tongue, lips and eyebrows) are not appropriate.
- L. Fingernails should be kept neat with nails no more than ¹/₄ "in length, no artificial nails. This includes acrylic and gel artificial nails. Nail polish, if worn, must not be chipped.
- M. Hair must be neat, clean and pulled back during patient care, if it is longer than shoulder length, with no extreme hair styles.
- N. For infection control purposes, cloth stethoscope covers are not to be worn.
